Class Number: 25
Class Name: **Computer 1** (Elective)
Length of Class: One Year
Prerequisite: None (Typing VERY helpful)
Grade Level: 10-12

Computer 1 is a course designed to introduce the students to computers and to their many uses. Students will be exposed to a variety of software packages including word processing, spreadsheets, and basic desktop publishing software packages.

Class Number: 26
Class Name: **Computer 2** (Elective)
Length of Class: One Semester (Fall)
Prerequisite: None (Typing VERY helpful)
Grade Level: 10-12

This course emphasizes the full use of the Microsoft Office programs including Word, Excel and Powerpoint. Students will also begin various Internet research assignments as well as basic Web Page design. Various other software applications will be explored as an extension from Computer I.

Class Number: 27
Class Name: **Computers in Society**
Length: One Semester (Spring)
Prerequisite: Computer 1
Grade Level: 10-12

This class would explore how computers affect society. Topics covered will include things such as ethics of computer usage, copyright laws and advertising. Electronic Mail and Internet use will also be discussed. Students will also have an opportunity to explore/evaluate computers and careers. Students will be reading/summarizing and analyzing computer and software reviews and articles.

Class Number: 154
Class Name: **Computer Technology**
Length of Class: 1 semester
Prerequisite: None

This course would be the entry-level course for the DMACC computer technician program. Dual credit will be given by Colo-NESCO High School and DMACC. The course is going to concern working with computer systems and actually fixing computers. At this time we do not have a site, no firm plans as to what time of day the class will actually be taught. Transportation will be the responsibility of the students and her/his parents. The students will receive opportunities in Microsoft Operative Systems, Network Technologies and there will be a certification test cost that will be the responsibility of the students.
